Resident Spotlight:

ANNE WEEKS Treasuring Friendship Every Day



Anne Weeks believes in making the best of every day and doing what makes you happy. For Anne, that means a daily walk around Francis House, a 4:30 cocktail and watching as many sports games as she can on television. Syracuse University basketball, the Buffalo Bills and the New York Yankees are her favorite teams.

Volunteers and staff look forward to visiting with Anne every day. Her smile brightens up a room. She has a love for conversation and learning about other people. When asked how she so easily forms friendships Anne replied, "It's just who I am. It is important to let people know they matter and you care."

Anne says she has many friends that she talks to on a regular basis. "Friendship doesn't demand anything much, just to be there. I have friends for 60 years, some 72 years, that still will call me on the phone every week, just to check in. That means so much."

Anne recalls many trips that she and her husband Jim, who passed away in 2015, went on with their friends Arnie and Mary Lou Cardillo. They traveled together to Hawaii, Alaska, Colorado and more. Anne is a great story teller and loves to share their many

adventures, including flying in a small plane around Mount McKinley.

Anne was born in Tully and grew up on the family cow farm, that also grew cabbage and potatoes. The cabbage was used by the sauerkraut plant in Amber. "When you are a farm family everyone pitches in. My brothers would help with the tractors and my sister and I would do whatever chores were needed."

Anne met her husband Jim at Forest Home, a popular hangout on Otisco Lake. "It took him three times to ask me out on a date before I said yes," laughs Anne. But from that first date onward, they were together.

Anne's love of sports was strengthened by Jim's love of sports. He was a decorated athlete being named to the SUNY Morrisville Athletic Wall of Fame as a national basketball standout. He led the nation for many years with an average of 35-38 points per game. "And that was before there were 3 pointers," adds Anne.

Anne and Jim married in 1958 and moved to Rochester where Jim played semi-pro basketball and worked as buyer for General Dynamics. Anne worked as the cafeteria manager for the Rochester City School District. They had three children: Karen, Janet and Michael.

While in Rochester, Anne and Jim bought a cottage on Otisco Lake, returning often to the area they loved. Two of their children, Karen and Janet moved back to the area, and Michael remains in Rochester. Anne cherishes the time she spends with her family. Jim passed away in 2015, but she knows he is still with her every day. She has 9 grandchildren and 3 great-grandchildren. She is now awaiting the birth of 3 great-grandchildren due in October, November and December.

Anne admits it is hard when life changes so fast. "I went from my home, to a small apartment, to Francis House in two years. That is extremely hard because I love my freedom and independence." Anne says she has learned to see the gift of receiving help from others. "Everyone here is so helpful. They know me and what I like and they often do things before I even ask!"


Sandi and Sharon are house volunteers. They are known for their cookie baking and staff always find their way




Glimpses Of God...In You And Me, by Sister Kathleen Osbelt is now available for purchase!




