Resident Spotlight

JANICE “JAN” FLEISCHMANN



At first blush, the quiet, reserved Janice Fleischmann somewhat shyly describes her history as “an interesting life” but “nothing too unusual really.” The details revealed in the telling, however, paint a somewhat different story.

After all, how many young housewives in the early 1960’s would and could uproot their Endicott, NY household on a Thursday

and reinvent it in another city hundreds of miles away by the following Monday for a 2–3-month span? Janice did just that more than 6 times over the course of her husband Paul’s 40-year career and with their daughter Laura in tow.

Janice and Paul met as preschoolers in the Waterville, NY area where she lived next door to Paul’s aunt, whom he would visit often. They then attended the same local schools and started “going together” in high school when she was a junior and he a senior. Their married life began in 1958 and lasted until Paul’s passing at Francis House in January 2021. “My husband and I were married 63 years, that’s probably one of the most important parts of my life and the part I’m most proud of,” Jan said.

As a mechanical engineer for Link Simulation in Binghamton, NY, Paul worked on the Apollo space

mission developing the astronaut training simulator and later on the ultra-secret “Black Project.” The work took him and the family to Houston, Texas and Cape Canaveral, FL for those extended periods throughout the years. When asked about those no-notice moves, Janice said, “I look back and I thought, how did we do it? But when you’re young, you do what you do.” She did put her foot down once—when Laura was in kindergarten and Jan needed documents to enroll her daughter in a new school. Since Laura’s school was already closed for the weekend, Jan told Paul she couldn’t be ready in time—she would need an extra day. Laura would later attend school with several future astronauts and Jan would discover the “Black Project” was actually the B-2 bomber. “Now I can say it,” Jan laughed.

Janice sometimes worked as a bookkeeper and a secretary, “back when they called them secretaries but I have supported the home mostly,” she said. “We are a small family but very close,” she noted, for which her daughter is especially glad. “Mom was my first best friend,” Laura Rozelsky wrote in an email, adding that “Mom & Dad were loving, supportive parents to both (my husband) Ted & me, and we were blessed to share heartfelt friendship with them.” Jan clearly expressed her fondness for her son-in-law: “He’s like a son,” she said of Ted. “He’s top notch.” She and


In this, our 31st year, the Francis House family of staff, caregivers, and volunteers remain dedicated to Sister's vision and committed to the privilege of serving our community.

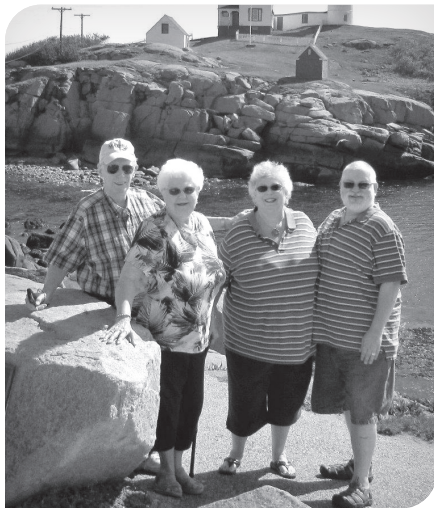

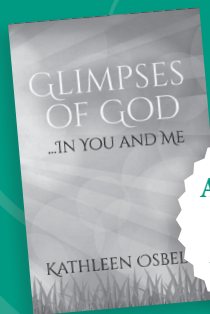

Meet Luke DeLorenzo, Vice President of Mission Outreach, Francis House Youth Auxiliary Board

High School: Christian Brothers Academy, Class of 2023

Hometown: Luke lives in the Eastwood area of Syracuse with his mother and father and his brother, Rocco.

Luke, how did you learn about Francis House?

My grandmother was a resident of Francis House when I was much younger. And my older brother also served on the Youth Auxiliary when he was in high school.

What inspired you to join the Youth Auxiliary?

I wanted to support Francis House and support the compassionate care that is given to its residents; the same compassionate care my grandma received when she was there.

What Youth Auxiliary activities have you been involved in since joining?

I have participated in mission outreach. I sold Francis House items and jewelry at community events and last fall our Auxiliary picked apples for the Francis House kitchens and for volunteers to use for baking. My family made and delivered a meal for Francis House and I held a paper towel drive in my neighborhood, collecting what I've learned is an item in steady need at Francis House. I liked doing the paper towel drive the most because it gave me a chance to personally connect with the people in my community.

Back in February, Sister Kathleen Osbelt spoke to the Youth Auxiliary about the founding of Francis House. What were your thoughts?

I was amazed by Sister Kathleen. Her story of taking in and caring for a woman with HIV, which led to the founding of Francis House, reminded me of Mother Teresa's story of caring for the lepers when no one else would. I think that Sister embodies every aspect that Francis House stands for: Compassion, Acceptance, Respect, and Dignity.

What do you think makes Francis House so special?

I think that the volunteers make Francis House so special. A few volunteers can always help an organization out, but to have enough volunteers to help run the House is amazing. So many people, called by God, put work into Francis House, and great results are produced because of that.

Luke, what is your favorite subject in high school and what are your favorite after-school activities?

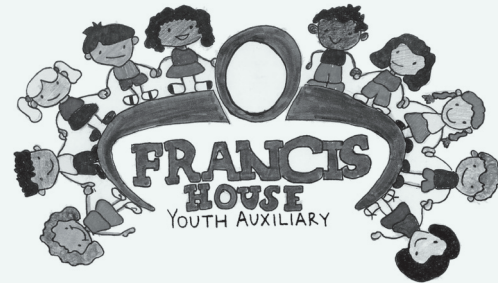
My favorite classes are physics and chemistry. For activities, I play lacrosse and soccer for CBA, and I play soccer for the Eastwood Fire community team.

In Loving Memory of SISTER KATHLEEN OSBELT



We are deeply grateful for the outpouring of love honoring the life of our founder, Sister Kathleen Osbelt. Sister passed away May 4, 2022 after a courageous battle with cancer. Her vision and her dedication changed our community forever with the founding of Francis House in 1991. We are deeply saddened that she is no longer with us but find comfort in knowing she is at peace. We will miss her strength, grace, wit and wisdom.

A SERVANT LEADER

Francis House was the dream of Sister Kathleen Osbelt. Serving as a hospital chaplain in the 1980s, she realized there were few, if any, places outside of a hospital setting where individuals could spend their final days. Sister also realized there were many in our community who, due to lack of family or resources, did not have the choice to die at home.

"She was the epitome of God's grace."

After serving as a volunteer companion for a woman dying of AIDS, Sister Kathleen confirmed the lack of support and services available to people who were dying. She set a vision for a place where all people—regardless of faith, race, ethnicity, financial status—could spend their final days. A place where every resident would be surrounded by family-style love in their final days.

With unwavering support from the community, Francis House, at 108 Michaels Avenue, opened in 1991. Just seven years later, it expanded to two homes with 16 private bedrooms.

Uniquely, Francis House was founded as a 'community care' home, the first of its kind in New York State. Sister Kathleen's



decision to designate Francis House as a private community home meant foregoing third-party insurance reimbursements and funds from federal, state, and local governments. Instead, she believed that the generosity of the community would sustain Francis House.

In 2022, its 31st year of service, Francis House employs 34 staff members, is blessed by the talents of more than 200 volunteers and is supported by the generosity of thousands of dedicated, compassionate supporters who have funded its mission steadfastly. This has enabled Francis House to care for more than 3,900 residents with unconditional love, a home-like atmosphere, respect, and dignity.

The Inspiration for "Glimpses of God... In You and Me" by Sister Kathleen Osbelt

I was on my way to give a talk that would begin a Lenten retreat. The reflection would be on Luke 4: 1-13, the Temptation in the Desert.

The church was a half-hour drive from my home and I remember it being a sunny morning, so I relished the time to enjoy God's beauty along the way. Having left the house early, I was calm... but then felt an urgency to re-read Luke 3. "Why? I'm already prepared," I thought. "This is crazy." The insight continued, stop and read Luke chapter 3. The voice was too strong for me to ignore.

With reluctance, I pulled the car over to the side of the road and reached for my Bible. I opened to Luke 3:31. Jesus had just been baptized and was at prayer when a voice was heard: "You are my beloved Son, on you my favor rests." Then the beginning of Luke 4:3 quotes the devil as saying to Jesus: IF you are the Son of God then the food, material possessions, and power will follow if the devil is worshiped. Why didn't I see that before? The big IF?

How could we, each of us, be the beloved of God? How could you or I be a son or daughter of God? That is just reserved for Jesus. Not true! Our very existence gives proof of our 'belovedness.'

You exist: therefore, you are the beloved of God.

The experience on the road that day led to a theme, which found itself woven in all my musings, readings, lectures and searches for truth.

The Good News is even better than we could ever imagine! You are "the beloved!" You reflect God's infinite faces of goodness when you act out of your true loving nature.

Founded in Unconditional Love A Reflection by Sister Kathleen Osbelt

The Gospel of St. John quotes Jesus as saying, "I have come that you might have life and have it in abundance." (John 10:10)

Within every person is the longing for a fullness of life. It is love that brings forth that fullness, that abundance. That is why Francis House was begun 31 years ago—that persons may be given a full life until death.

We all desire to be loved and to love. Without love we perish. Is there a time more critical than the end of life for needing to feel that we are loved?

My constant cry when trying to establish Francis House was always, "No one should have to die alone!" To be able to establish a home where people are surrounded by love has been my/our greatest joy.

Whenever I am praying for intercession, I lift up my heart to all those who have died at Francis House for help, for it is they who have taught us about loving and they who have been loved.

More than 31 years of ministry has brought us hundreds of residents and volunteers whose lives have touched us and changed us in some way. We carry a bit of each other's spirit as we move toward our own final home.

Could there be a greater community of love and communion of saints? How blessed are we to have this ministry and privilege!
