



Ofran Ofragola: Giving & Receiving Unconditional Love

A hit by the Beatles in the late 1960s, "All You Need is Love" has need is love, endured for generations as the anthem for unconditional love. In Christian terms, unconditional love doesn't depend on the attitudes or actions of the recipient; it is merely extended.

— extended by the staff and volunteers to residents and families alike.



In her own individual and special way, Frances Fragola, now 92, has become the embodiment of unconditional acceptance and affection. This is only fitting because, according to her son, Dale, it's how she's lived her life.

Fran joined the Francis House family as a resident before the holidays last fall. Upon arrival, she had one request: that strings of Christmas lights be put up and that her collection of Christmas décor fill her room. She loves the holiday so much — and expressing it — that over the years she earned the nickname "Mrs. Christmas" by family, friends and neighbors. Sharing the joy of the season was how Fran came to be embraced by everyone in the house.



Fran grew up on Syracuse's north side and began working at age 16. She eventually married and settled in Liverpool. Years later, after a divorce, Fran embraced her role as a single mother and sole provider to the couple's two young boys, John Jr. and Dale. To keep the little family together, Fran worked two jobs: at a local pharmacy and then at Sam Dell Dodge as a bookkeeper until her retirement in 1995.

During her life, Fran Fragola extended unconditional love to her two boys, sacrificing as she raised them and as they became adults. Dale describes his mother as having wisdom, recalling that he and his brother would often say "mom was right" and "we should have listened to mom."

Growing up, John Jr. and Dale came to admire Fran's loving nature and her work ethic, as well as everything she did to take care of her family and her home. She enjoyed mowing the lawn and shoveling snow and loved to bake, especially her signature Pizzelles, traditional Italian waffle cookies.

While John Jr. moved to California, Dale remained at home, returning the same unconditional love to his mother that he had received as a son. Dale, who retired several years ago from Chrysler - New Process Gear, had purchased the family home where he still resides and where he cared for Fran for many years.

Keeping Dale and Fran company over the years were their beloved canine companions: Magic, then Curly, both Sheepdogs. Missing the companionship and loyalty a dog shares with its owner, they acquired a six-week-old Goldendoodle fourand-a-half years ago and named him Maneater, after one of Dale's late golfing buddies. Manny, as he's called, has become a regular visitor to Francis House and beloved by everyone at the residence. Dale visits his mom daily for four to five hours, and Manny nuzzles with Fran and awaits affection and treats from the staff.

Today, Fran continues to delight in several indulgences: candy, sweets and having her hair and nails done weekly by Kathy, who provides these services as a volunteer. Dale, who describes his mom as determined, strong willed and good natured, is inspired by her continued embrace of life and sharing of her joy.

Fran says it was divine intervention that she became a resident of Francis House. She credits sharing her name with St. Francis of Assisi. He is known to have said, "Remember that when you leave this earth, you can take with you nothing that you have received, only what you have given: a full heart, enriched by honest service, love, sacrifice and courage."

Over many years, Fran Fragola has embodied the qualities St. Francis ascribed to a life well lived. These same qualities have been returned to her — unconditionally — by the Francis House family. As the song says, all you need is love; love is all you need.

Volunteer Spotlight: MEET TOM RICHARDS

When did you begin volunteering for Francis House?

I learned of Francis House in 2002 through my employer, Agway. Francis House was a beneficiary of our golf tournament. In 2006, I moved to South Carolina, where I had previously been stationed when I served in the Air Force. I returned to Syracuse in 2018 and came back to Francis House as a maintenance volunteer.



What drew you to volunteer at Francis House?

The impact that Francis House

has is tremendous. We help people when they are most vulnerable. It's about helping the families as much as the residents. Francis House rejects the idea of turning away from people at the end of their life, which so many people seem to do. Francis House is all about unconditional love.

What is your favorite part about volunteering here?

It's the people, including the residents. There's one resident I remember well. She was from the Dingle Peninsula of Ireland, and she was a resident here just when I was planning a trip there. We bonded over travel. I also enjoy visiting with the residents who are veterans.

A passion of yours is woodworking. You built and installed a book lending library, modeled after the original Francis House. And, you have also built a bookcase, Tau cross, and cherry frames for us. How did this passion start?

I originally learned from my father. I was a high school Spanish teacher for seven years and started building with wood over the summers. I would make different things to sell for extra income. I remember one year I made wooden rocking horses that my wife and I sold all the way up until Christmas.

The Francis House book library was a big project. It took about five months to build. At first, the plan was for it to be just a regular book lending box. Then we decided to design it to look like the original Francis House at 108 Michaels Ave. I used historic photos we found in Francis House brochures as references. Then I had to think about how to weatherproof it. So I took siding from the original house and cut it into strips, and used original house shingles for the library roof. Then we thought, how will people know what it is? So I cut the big windows into the side. My son asked, what about when it's dark? So we added the light inside. At first it was just going to be battery powered, but then I found the solar panel.

Note: The Francis House Little Library is located behind Francis House, near the 114 entrance.
