Although facing a terminal illness, Catherine Ann Golden considers herself fortunate.

"While I never thought I would be a Francis House resident," Cathy says, "given the circumstances, I couldn't possibly be anywhere more welcoming, loving, and peaceful right now."

Part of the reason Cathy says she feels comfortable and very much at home is because she knew Sister Kathleen Osbelt, Francis House founder. A parishioner of St. Augustine's Church in Baldwinsville, Cathy fondly recalls Sister Kathleen's involvement with her congregation: for a time, Sister delivered the homily at Mass once a month and participated in and led numerous women's retreats. "I remember her messages, the twinkle in her eye, and her keen sense of humor," she says.

Cathy is passionate about many aspects of life—history, music, service, and her Irish heritage, for example—but says "my faith and my family have been the constant sources of strength and companionship my whole life."

The family feeling nurtured by the staff and volunteers at Francis House appeals to Cathy as an extension of her own close clan. She has two brothers—Bob and his wife, Ika, in Idaho; and Michael and his wife, Amy, in Colorado; and her sister, Maureen, and brother-in-law, Mark, in Baldwinsville, plus three nieces, three nephews and 24 first cousins. "It's been a blessing in my life to have had strong family connections, developed by my father and mother, who passed away in 2009 and 2015, respectively."



Cathy has led a full life. She graduated from the University of Virginia with a BA in History and spent a summer semester in Ireland, saying that the experience "cemented my love of Irish literature, poetry, and spirituality, as well as Irish music." After college, she worked for her family's restaurant and inn in Geneva until they sold it and then moved to Sarasota, where she served as an Assistant Manager at an Eckerd Drug Store. When she returned to Syracuse, she continued her career in retail, working until July, when her illness progressed.

On Dec. 10, Cathy was a recipient of the Diocese of Syracuse's Immaculata Award, conferred by Bishop Douglas Lucia at the Cathedral. The award was accepted on her behalf by her sister, Maureen Golden Murphy. Cathy was nominated by her parish, St. Augustine in Baldwinsville, NY, "for her faithful and dedicated service to Christ and His Church," according to St. Augustine's Pastoral Associate, Debra Krisher. Bishop Lucia stressed in his remarks that "she truly exemplifies what the award represents: leadership in church life."

Cathy has relished the serenity that Francis House provides, and as her favorite mantra, the Serenity Prayer, invokes, has accepted "the things I cannot change." Serenity, courage, and wisdom are attributes that Sister Kathleen exemplified in her own life and now, through Cathy, provide continuing inspiration for us all.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE



The dream of Francis House began with our founder, Sister Kathleen Osbelt. In 2024, Francis House celebrates 33 years of offering compassionate end-of-life care. We have been blessed to be a home to more than 4,000 residents and to have supported more than 13,000 families.

We are blessed by the leadership of our Board of Directors and its many specialized committees. Currently, our Buildings and Grounds Committee is considering how Francis House can serve our community in even more

ways. They are leading an assessment of our current property, and the new property that was recently offered to us. They are envisioning how we can welcome more residents into our care, and how we can support the needs of families, staff, volunteers, and visitors – and all who share the spaces throughout our home. This work by our Board brings excitement to our 33rd anniversary year. It reflects our shared goals to want to serve more people, to stay on Michaels Avenue, and to broaden our impact.

Francis House has been given an opportunity to purchase four homes surrounding the Michaels Avenue homes: two houses on Court Street and two houses on Kirkpatrick Street. It is such a blessing that the opportunity to purchase these properties presented itself. We are limited to the number of beds we can provide, so we have identified areas that can expand Sr. Kathleen's mission. There is a need for education and support in the community to families who have a loved one in their last months of life as well as support after the passing of a loved one. Also, we desperately need more parking space for families, volunteers, and all those that visit Francis House. We are being respectful of those tenants who have current leases. We are currently formulating a plan for the future to continue Sr. Kathleen's mission and vision. We continue to be blessed with community support and want to give back to the community that is so giving to us. Just as important, we want to stay on Michaels Avenue where Sr. Kathleen built her mission.

As we embark on this new and exciting opportunity, we recall how Sr. Kathleen made what was thought to be impossible a reality. She followed the teachings of St. Francis to "start by doing what is necessary, then what is possible, and suddenly you are doing the impossible."

We ask God to continue to bless and guide Francis House, our staff, volunteers, and our donors. We are looking forward to continuing Sr. Kathleen's vision, mission, and values to always be present to those most in need at the end of their lives.

certified pet therapy teams that grace Francis House with their compassion, company, and cuddles. We sat down with Andrea and asked her about her experience volunteering at Francis House.

What brought you to Francis House?


My friend's mother was a resident at Francis House in 2022. She would bring her Cavalier when she visited her mom and saw how much joy it brought not just her, but everyone at Francis House. She encouraged me to reach out to the volunteer manager, Rea Carver, to ask about visiting with Chloe. It's not something we had planned on, but Francis House was a perfect fit. It all just fell into place!

What has been your favorite part about volunteering here?

Everything! I love the atmosphere here. There is so much warmth and kindness. I always leave feeling grateful that I could make at least one person smile, who maybe was having a difficult morning. It's as helpful for staff and family members as much as residents. Sometimes the resident is asleep, but the family members still ask for a visit. I get as much out of it as anyone else. I have a deep love for animals, and being able to bring Chloe here brings me great joy.

Do you have a favorite memory from your time volunteering with us?

There was one resident soon after we started who just loved Chloe. She made me promise that I would visit her every week. She said, "Please don't ever walk by my door, even if I am sleeping. Please come in." One day we came in and she was very close to the end of her life. She seemed to be asleep and I wasn't sure if I should go in, but I remembered my promise. I don't think she recognized me, but as soon as she saw Chloe



We tried to ask Chloe what she thought about volunteering at Francis House. She just wagged her tail and pulled Andrea towards the hall in the direction of the resident rooms so they could continue their visits.


