A CENTURY OF FAMILY LOVE

The year 1924 was notable in many respects. Lenin died and Marlon Brando was born. The first Winter Olympics took place in France, Calvin Coolidge was elected U.S. president, and Caesar Cardini created the first-ever Caesar salad at his restaurant in Tijuana, Mexico. A baby destined to also become president, Jimmy Carter, came into the world on October 1.



Nancy Edinger began her own earthly journey that year as well. The Francis House resident, who turned 100 on May 4, reflects on living a full life these past 100 years, filled with memories of family, hobbies, learning, and volunteering.

Nancy grew up on Syracuse's Northside. Her father co-owned the Muench-Kreutzer Candle

Company, which was nearby the original MacArthur Baseball Stadium, and she recalls watching games from the upper windows of the factory.

When she was six, her family moved to the Strathmore neighborhood. She graduated from Onondaga Valley Academy in 1943, and then attended the Katherine Gibbs School in New York City and Hobart William Smith College, followed by serving as an executive secretary in banking before marriage.



Nancy says the proudest achievement of her long lifetime is the five children she and husband, Roger, raised in the same house where she grew up. Dan, Betsy, John, Sue, and David attended city schools, where their mom was an active volunteer.

"I can't take much credit," Nancy claims. "Their father and I gave them the tools to succeed, but they did it themselves. I was lucky that my parenting style — my daughters call it 'benign neglect' — matched the safety of the time." The Edinger family was close, spending summers on Otisco and Skaneateles Lakes, celebrating major holidays together, attending services at Most Holy Rosary church, and enjoying big dinners at home. "Today the cottage is shared by all five families and my great grandchildren enjoy it just as their parents did," she says.



Hobbies filled Nancy's life with creativity and friendships. Knitting and playing Bridge have been consistent activities in her life, as was reading as a member of the Strathmore Book Club for many years. Later in life she took up jigsaw puzzles, computer card games, and became a volunteer with Contact Community Services.

"Probably one of the biggest challenges I have had to overcome is losing my eyesight to the extent had to give up many things I once enjoyed," says Nancy. "But I have had a very easy life, so I can't complain. You can't expect life to be perfect."



On her coming to Francis House, Nancy says "I was sad about leaving my home. And while I thought I was leaving my family, I didn't realize I'd find an even bigger one here. We could not have imagined the love and care that is here at Francis House."

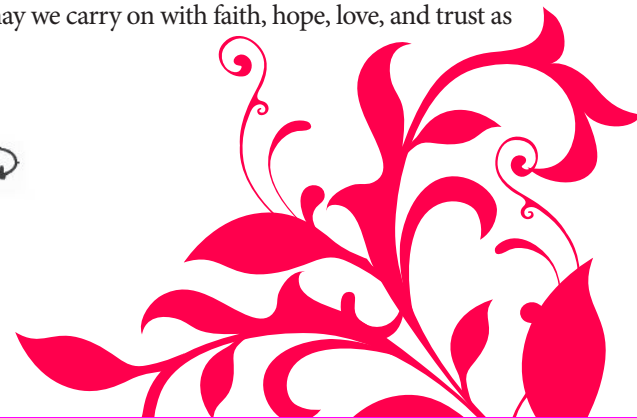

VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT: *

Robin Cerro

Robin Cerro is one of the few current volunteers who remembers when residents stayed on two floors in the “old house,” the two-family home that now houses our administrative offices. She started volunteering in 1993, just two years after Francis House opened. At that time, volunteers were helping to care for residents 24/7.



Robin was a nurse, and her expertise was invaluable in her role as a volunteer. She assisted Sr. Kathleen and Sr. Geraldine with admissions, helping new residents to get settled into the home.

Robin still fondly remembers the old house, even with all its quirks. “There were three rooms on each floor, so you ran up and down the stairs a lot. Getting residents upstairs to the second floor was a real challenge until the chair lift was installed,” she remembers. Robin took some time off from volunteering to raise her children and work full time. She returned in August of 2018 as a kitchen volunteer. We sat down with Robin and asked her to reminisce on her years as a Francis House volunteer.

What brought you to Francis House?

My husband learned about Francis House at church one day. He came home and told me about how they needed volunteers, so I decided to see what it was all about. I was able to volunteer a few hours a week around my kids’ schedules and my work schedule. Specifically, I helped new residents feel comfortable at Francis House after they first arrived. Helping people to feel at home was so fulfilling. I had to stop volunteering after about six months because it no longer worked with my family’s schedule. I always knew that I wanted to come back to Francis House and volunteer again, and I was so happy to return as a kitchen volunteer in 2018. It’s very different from what I did before and from my career in the medical field, and I really enjoy the change of pace. I love feeding people, so it’s a perfect fit.

What do you enjoy about volunteering at Francis House?

Working at Francis House has been the most meaningful work I’ve ever done. I get much more than I give. You walk out after your shift is over and you feel full. This has become my work. You develop relationships with residents and their families and make a lot of connections with other volunteers too. I love working with the other volunteers on Sunday afternoons. There is a core group of us who usually work together each week and we have a certain rhythm in the kitchen. I wouldn’t want it any other way.

Do you have any memorable moments from your time as a volunteer?

There was one beautiful spring afternoon my first year as a volunteer. The volunteer coordinator and I helped get a couple of the residents into wheelchairs, and we took them around the block together. It was a lovely day, and it was so nice to see the residents enjoying themselves outside. They loved the fresh air and the sunshine.



Another memory that really sticks out is the Blizzard of 1993. I was scheduled to volunteer that day. Did you know that you can’t walk through 43 inches of snow? I’m not originally from Syracuse, so I had no idea what that much snow was like. I drove in from Liverpool and they hadn’t plowed Michaels Avenue

yet. I parked behind Francis House where the sisters were living at the time and I thought I could walk through the snow to Francis House because it was so close. I think I ended up crawling out because I couldn’t walk through it, but I got to the parking lot and was able to make it to the door.
