Willie "Jack" Dyer

When Willie "Jack" Dyer arrived at Francis House in August his daughter Angela says, "We walked through the door and it felt just like home and my dad looked so at peace."

Home and family were the most important things in Jack's life. Although Jack was a fiercely independent and hardworking man, he loved being surrounded by family. When Jack wasn't working, he enjoyed the family's annual trip to Georgia visiting his siblings and extended family members. Holidays were marked by celebration and Jack's self-proclaimed "best BBQ ribs in Syracuse."

Jack was born in Cordele, GA in 1934 and grew up on a farm as the youngest boy of seven children. He joined the Army and served until he was 23. Soon after his return Jack met Janie on a blind date at the Georgia State County Fair. Their parents required a chaperone, Janie's older brother, on every date. Jack and Janie married in 1959 and had 7 children; 4 boys and 3 girls; Brenda, Angela, Jeffrey, Anthony, Jennifer, Theresa and Willie.

In 1965, Jack and Janie moved their family to Syracuse to be close to Jack's brother Jerry. Jack was trained as a car body repairman and worked for City Taxi and other car dealers in Syracuse. He eventually opened his own business. When Jack wasn't repairing cars he loved to fish, bowl, and watch his favorite baseball team, the LA Dodgers. Jack was also an accomplished singer. He was the president and director of the male chorus at New Hope Missionary Baptist Church. He helped start male choir groups at other churches. Jack and his brother, Jerry were instrumental in starting the quartet group "The New Hope Bible School Singers". The group loved to travel the east coast and sang for churches and church events. The group recorded a 45 record in the late 60's.

Angela witnessed many beautiful moments while her dad lived at Francis House. "Our family is grateful for the caregivers. Not only did they provide extraordinary care for my father, they were very attentive to us, always asking us if we needed anything." Angela and her family are grateful for Father Mike who came in regularly to pray with her father. "As Christians, this meant a lot because prayer is very important to us."

Angela recalls one day when Sister Kathleen Osbelt stopped in to see Jack. "I told her that my father had not responded to me that day as he had in the past days. Sister said a prayer and placed her hands on his forehead. His eyes opened up so wide and he looked towards her as if he could see her...I will always cherish that moment."

Jack passed away on August 25, 2020. We were blessed to have Jack live his last days with all of us at Francis House.

Other staff members volunteered to work from home or take temporary leave. Volunteers sent meals, baked goods, cards and prayers. We received donations from the stimulus checks of benefactors who were grateful to be working. The capacity to persevere.

There is a peace in knowing your purpose. There is a humility in being grateful. There is a recognition of blessing when you are able to serve selflessly. There is resilience in perseverance.
