
# **Resident Spotlight:**

# ROBERT "BOB" BISHOP



"I love people and I live every day with joy," says Bob Bishop from the comfort of his chair in a sunny corner of his room. "It's easy to do, just spread kindness," he adds with a smile, as he reflects on 94 years of 'a wonderful life.' Framed photographs fill


Bob's shelves and snapshots cover his bulletin board, displaying memories with Betty, his wife of 52 years, his seven children, eight grandchildren, and six great-grandchildren.

Bob became a resident of Francis House in November 2021. He quickly became known for his smile, charm and quick wit. Bob says he enjoys visiting with the care staff and also watching sports, particularly the Buffalo Bills and SU football and basketball games. "It's easy to smile surrounded by the people here. It really is a home away from home. Everyone is just wonderful."

Bob was raised in the hamlet of Mottville, NY, one of seven children. In 1944 Bob's older brother joined the Army. A year later, inspired by his brother, Bob enlisted in the Navy, foregoing his senior year at Skaneateles High School for basic training at the Sampson Naval Training Station. After training, Bob returned home to marry his high school sweetheart, Betty, then he set off for gunnery training and an assignment on the USS Franklin D. Roosevelt aircraft carrier. Following active duty during World War II, Bob returned safely home and joined his father-in-law in operating the family meat market in Weedsport, NY, a job he would enjoy for the next 25 years.

"Betty and I settled in Skaneateles Falls, NY, and raised our family. We did everything as a family – camping, boating, snowmobiling—we just loved being together." When Bob learned that Sugardale Foods was looking for a salesman, he applied and began what would become a 22-year career with the company. "I loved my sales job. My philosophy in sales was to sell yourself first and the rest would come naturally, and that's what I did." An approach that earned him Salesman of the Year more than a few times. Last month, Sugardale Foods donated the Francis House Christmas ham – after receiving a request from Bob's son. "That really made me happy!" said Bob of the donation.

Bob and Betty enjoyed a Panama Cruise in the mid-90s. Shortly after their travels, Bob recalls, Betty experienced a series of strokes and died in 1998. Bob also experienced the loss of three of his children. "Betty and I had great kids. I told them all I'd help them pay for college. It was important to me that they have a good education, especially since I dropped out of school at 17."

After retiring, Bob took up golfing, enjoying regular tee times with his brother, Bill. "I played three times a week. I wasn't very good but I enjoyed it anyway." He also went on annual cruises – 11 total over the years. Retirement also provided Bob the time he needed to achieve one of his life

goals – earning his diploma. "I went to BOCES for two and a half years to earn my GED (General Education Diploma). I was constantly asking the teacher for help. She was a saint. She spent so much time with me," he laughs. "It was math – that was the class that gave me a headache," Bob says. "I invited my teacher to my graduation party to thank her for putting up with me."

Bob says his determination combined with a sense of gratitude through the years helped to shape his wonderful life. That, and his commitment to kindness. "What can I say, I just love people."


